About this time next month, I'll be attending the Regional Assembly of the Christian Church in Kentucky, which will be held in Mt. Sterling, KY. All the Disciples churches and ministers will gather for three days of worship, fellowship, education and business. I'm looking forward to a wonderful experience.

Did you even know we are a part of a larger body called The Christian Church in Kentucky? The headquarters is in Lexington, and you may have met our Regional Minister, Rev. Dr. Don Gillett, and Associate Regional Minister, Rev. Molly Smothers, at my installation service, and several other ministers serve on the Regional staff as well.

So, what does the Region of Kentucky do? Well, to keep it simple... the Region does what we as an individual congregation cannot do by ourselves.

The Region:

1. Helps congregations find ministers as well as helps ministers find congregations to serve.

2. Runs and maintains our two camps – Camp Wakon'Da-Ho located near the town of Liberty and Camp Kum-Ba-Ya located on the Kentucky Lake.

3. Gathers all of the Disciples from the Region for men's, women's, and youth events.

4. Aids in preparing ministers to serve.

5. Provides pastoral care for both ministers and churches when needed.

The Region does more than this, but the above covers most of how they serve us. As you can see, being a part of the Region is vital to who we are, and being a part of it reminds us that we are not alone and that we cannot do this alone. We are always just one part of the much larger church, the universal church which spans all times and all spaces.

I ask you to include in your prayers the Region of Kentucky and the upcoming Regional

Assembly as we gather in early August. Pray for the participants and for the work of the church throughout our Commonwealth. As I always exclaimed in seminary, "Disciples rock!!!"

The 2024 Regional Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Kentucky will be held August $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ in Mount Sterling. Our host churches are High Street Christian Church, Somerset Christian Church, and First Christian Church, Mount Sterling. This will be the first Regional Assembly hosted in Eastern Kentucky.

The assembly will feature:

- Rev. David Emery currently lead pastor of Harvard Avenue Christian Church in Tulsa, OK and formerly with Middletown Christian Church in Louisville and with FCC, Mount Sterling – will be bringing the message at Friday worship.
- Music will range from a talented group of trad musicians to the Black Gospel Ensemble to hymns played on the pipe organ at FCC, Mount Sterling.
- Workshops will include topics such as an afternoon of service for youth; the bi-vocational church and the rural church; ways our churches can work on updating and improving our constitutions and by-laws; the women's ministries in the 21st century; managing ministry for dementia patients and their caregivers; ways to enhance music in worship and enhance congregational participation; a representative from Pension Fund to speak with clergy and lay employees.
